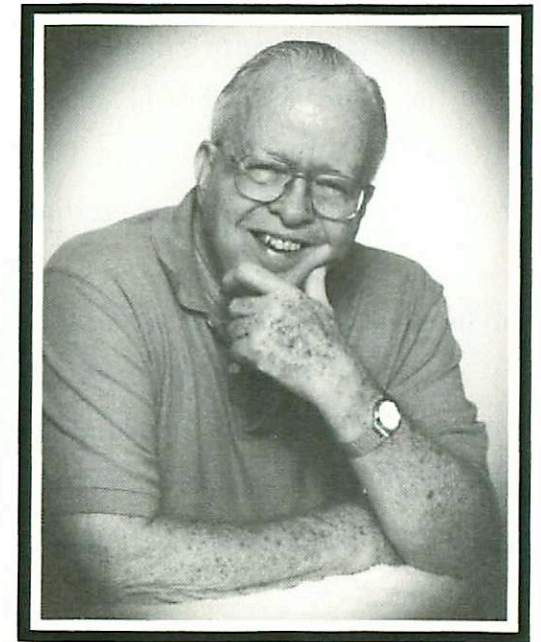

Obituary

Zane C. Hodges was born June 15, 1932, in Chambersburg, Pennsylvania, to the late Mrs. Virginia Hodges and Mr. Zebulon C. Hodges.

Zane is preceded in death by his mother, Mrs. Virginia Hodges; his father, Mr. Zebulon C. Hodges; and his brother, David Hodges.

Zane attended grade school in Chambersburg, Pennsylvania. He went on to further his education. He attended Wheaton College in Chicago, Illinois, from 1950 to 1954. From there he became a student at the Dallas Theological Seminary from 1954 to 1958. Soon after his graduation, Zane became a Professor at D.T.S. from 1959 to 1986. Also, while attending D.T.S., Zane became a faithful Sunday School teacher at The Old Mission in the early 50's and continued on to teach the Gospel at Victor St. Bible Chapel (formally The Old Mission) up until 2004.

Zane became the founder of Redencion Viva Publishers in 1981. He also was the founder of Kerugma Inc., his writing ministry, which was started up in the early 90's. Zane also has a long standing relationship with the Grace Evangelical Society.

Zane leaves behind all his cherished memories, all of his brothers and sisters in Christ.
